

Saving your Schedule in MyDailySchedule

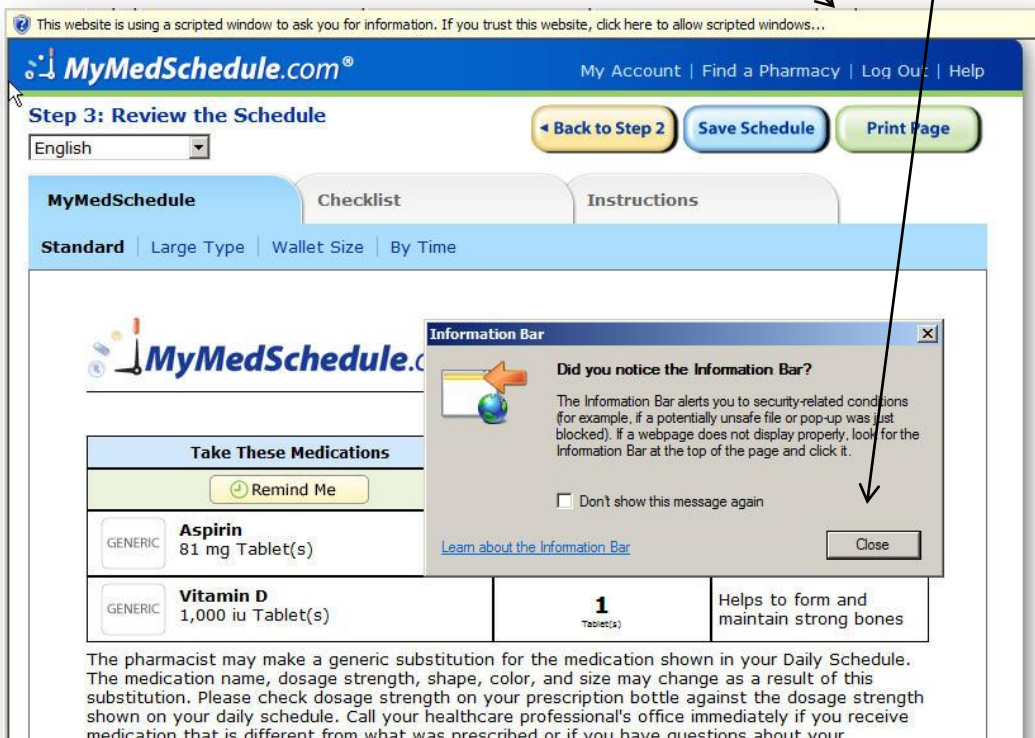
In **Step 3** **Click**



If you receive, an error message and possibly a Windows information bar, **Follow these instructions:**

Information Bar:
Click Close


Error Message:
Click next to the word windows on the error message.



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After you click next to the word windows you will see a pop up that says "Temporarily Allow Scripted Windows"
